Bullets Flew About Him While Driving in His Carriage Through a Square in Constantinople.

A man being pursued by the police drew a revolver on the Place Taxim and fired several shots at his pursuers. Mr. Terrell happened to be crossing the square in his carriage as the man fired and was in great danger of being hit.

This caused the Minister's cavass to jump from the carriage and seize the man who was firing. The latter tried to stab the cavass, but was overpowered

and arrested.
