

ARMENIA PRODS THE POWERS.

Berlin Treaty Called to the Attention of Foreign Ministers at Athens.

ATHENS, Dec. 2.—The Armenian committee here has presented to the Ministers of the signatory powers of the Berlin treaty a petition recounting the Sassoun outrages and imploring the powers referred to not to allow article 61 of the Berlin treaty to remain ineffective.

LONDON, Dec. 3—4 A. M.—The Daily News notes that it is believed that Prime Minister Rosebery is willing to grant an official hearing to the Armenians in London on the Sassoun affair.

A Constantinople despatch says it is reported that the British Foreign Minister has made strong representations to the Turkish Ambassador to Great Britain on the contents of the Porte's circular, and has insisted upon an honest inquiry into the outrages, and the necessity of better government in Armenia. His protests, coupled with the actions of Sir Philip Currie, British Ambassador to Turkey, has occasioned more anxiety and attracted more attention than anything yet done.

The Porte is becoming convinced that the powers are in earnest.
