

THE OUTRAGES IN ARMENIA.

A Commission of Inquiry to Investigate
Them Will Be at Once Sent by
the Turkish Government.

BERLIN, Nov. 23, 1894.—The Turkish Embassy
has received a despatch from Constantinople
stating that the Porte has arranged to send a
commission of inquiry to Armenia to investi-
gate the alleged outrages there. The commis-
sion will include Abdullah Pacha, Hafiz Tewfik
Pacha and others well known throughout the
Empire.

ARMENIANS IN HARTFORD.

I Send a Petition on Behalf of the Per-
secu'ed People to Secretary Gresham.

HARTFORD, Conn., Nov. 23, 1894.—The agita-
tion in behalf of the abused Armenians in their
native land has taken in this city the form of
a petition to Secretary of State Gresham, to in-
tervene in behalf of the persecuted people and
the cause of humanity. Malcom Agbamalla
today circulated the petition among the Arme-
nians here, and it will be sent to New Britain
tomorrow, to be signed by Armenians living
there. Mayor Brainard, of this city, and Mayor
Dunn, of New Britain, will affirm that they
know the signers to be good citizens. The ap-
plication is in the form of a protest against the al-
leged false assertion of the Turkish Minister at
Washington regarding the attitude of the Turk-
ish government toward the Kurds. Secretary
of State Gresham is asked to fairly investigate
existing conditions in Armenia.

A PLEA FOR INVESTIGATION.

Christians in Armenia.

The Turks have deceived the European Pow-
ers by their false reports, the signatures of
which were obtained by force under threat of
the sword from the wives and children of the

the disinterested nations who can form an un-
biased opinion of the existing conditions of un-
fortunate Christians in that country.

I am sure your influential paper will be, as
ever, the defender of the rights of the helpless
and oppressed.
