## 26,000 Armenians Said to Be in Arms— Turkish Reserves to Muster.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 30.—The Porte has sent a circular note to the Turkish representatives abroad in regard to the recent disturbances in the provinces, in which it is declared that the Armenians
