

UNITED ACTION FOR ARMENIA.

The so-called investigation which has been authorized by the Turkish government will be credited by nobody—not even the sultan. If the head of the Ottoman empire really desired a full and impartial inquiry into the Armenian horrors, he would have welcomed the cooperation of the representatives of Christian powers. By his own course he stands condemned before civilization.

Why should not England and Russia unite to secure for Armenia, once for all, the right of self-government, giving to her people the substantial guarantee of a joint protectorate?

International jealousies have hindered more than once the cause of justice. Surely, in this closing decade of the 19th century, nations which profess and call themselves Christians should join hands to see that one of the oldest of Christian peoples is freed from Moslem, misrule, tyranny and brutality.

The \$1350 sent by the sultan of Turkey as a contribution to the fund for the relief of sufferers by last year's forest fires isn't needed over here. It might be sent to some of the surviving sufferers in Armenia.
