MURDERED BY MOSLEMS.

Fifty Armenians Killed in the Market Place of Akhissar.

THEIR BODIES TOSSED INTO WELLS.

Was Market Day, and a Turkish Rough Shot a Christian to Start a Row.

"MASSACRE THE INFIDELS!" THEY SHOUTED

Sultan's Police Ignore Safe-Conduct Cards Given to Armenians by Foreign Ambassadors.

-A despatch that reliable 16.-A Constantinople says th fifty Armenians

were killed and a number wounded at Akhissar, in the villayet of Adin, on the Anatolian Railway, by a Moslem mob.

No women or children were injured, probably on account of the arrival of Kaimaikan from the village of Gieve, three miles distant, who made valiant

Kaimaikan from the village of Gieve, three miles distant, who made valiant efforts, at the risk of his own life, to save the Christians. Otherwise the slaughter would have been complete.

The panic among Christians is reviving in Constantinople on account of this isolated atack, and the Armenians are again flocking into the churches. The police disregard the safe-conduct cards given to the Armenians by the foreign embassics. They insult and maltreat the holders of them.

Latest advices from Constantinople say that M. Cambon, French Ambassador, and Sir Philip Currie, British Ambassador, presented to-day to Said Pasha, Minister of Foreign Affairs, the final demands of the Powers for Armenian reforms.

If these are not accepted an ultimatum will be presented. No further modifications will be permitted.

The scheme drops the demand for a Christian High Commissioner, but otherwise, it is almost identical with the proposals made last May. It is believed, nowever, that Russia hesitates to force an acceptance, because she fears untimate Armenian autonomy.

News received from Trebizond is to the effect that the Russian postal steamer is lying there with 2,000 Christian refugees on board. Two other vesuels, also full of refugees, are there twaiting the arrival of Russian ships to ransport them to Batoum.

A despatch from Athens describing he growing discontent of Turkish rule in the Island of Crete says that a band of 1,000 armed Christians met recently to Klima to petition the Sultan to retore the charter abolished in 1889, and or a reform of taxation and of the endarmerie.
