## Salisbury Says He Is Making a "Calamitous Mistake."

LONDON, Aug. 17.—Nothing in the opening of the new Parliament has attracted more attention than the warning that the Marquis of Salisbury gave to the Sultan of Turkey about the Armenian outrages. Here is what he said:

With respect to Armenia we have accepted the policy which our predecessors initiated, and our efforts will be directed to obtaining an adequate guarantee for the carrying out of reformboth France and Russia. The permanence of the Sultan's rule is involved in the conduct he pursues. If the cries of misery continue the Sultan must realize that Europe will become weary of appeals, and the fictitious strength which the powers have given the Empire will fall it. fail it. The Sultan will make a calamitous mistake if he refuses to accept the advice of the European powers relative to the reforms.

## LITTLE SCARE FOR BRITAIN.

Anarchists Appealed To in Turkish to Blow Up Parliament.

LONDON, Aug. 17.—The alleged discovery of a Turkish plot to blow up the Houses of Parliament has been given all the weight of an official investigation by Scotland Yard and a sensational scare in the newspapers. A few weeks ago the manager of a printing and lithographing company was asked by a foreigner to lithograph a weekly paper for a Turkish company. As no knowledge of the Turkish language was necessary for the job, the manager of the English concern undertook the contract. Thousands of copies of the Turkish weekly were sent abroad. It was through the officers of Scotland Yard that the printer learned that he had been instrumental in circulating

It was through the officers of Scotland Yard that the printer learned that he had been instrumental in circulating red-hot literature calling upon Anarchists and Socialists to combine for the purpose of blowing up the Houses of Parliament. One article stated that sixteen men were actually on their way to England from various points, in order to make necessary arrangements. The impression here is that there is more to the affair than appeared on the surface, and that the police have discovered the secret workings of a dangerous lot of Anarchists in London.

## A Warning to Bulgaria.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Aug. 17.—There is much irritation in official circles on account of recent events on the Bulgarian frontier. Instructions have been forwarded to the Ottoman representatives to request the Powers to caution Bulgaria aganist permitting a recurrence of them.
