MAVROYENI BEY REPORTS. NO AMERICANS WERE INJURED.

But Turks at Tarsus Assaulted the Cook Employed by Professor Christie.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22.-Acting Secretary McAdoo to-day received a note from Mayroyeni Bey, the Turkish Minister to the United States, saying that the Turkish Government

has informed him that a thorough investigation had been made of alleged outrages on Americans at Tarsus. The result of these investigations, he wrote, was to the effect that

the cook in the family of Professor Christie, of St. Paul's Institute, at Tarsus, had been assaulted by native Turks, and that no Americans were concerned in the matter nor in-

jured. Mayroyeni Bey also stated that the Turkish offenders would be tried and punished. The State Department expects to receive information in the same affair from United States officials in Turkey, as Minister Terrell advised the department some time ago that he

had taken steps to have the matter investi-
