The Massacre of Armenian Christians.
Arguing from the precedents in Bulgaria
and Damascus, the Armenians in this city
assume that the despatches concerning the
butchery of the six thousand of their
Christian fellow countrymen in Asia Minor

are true. There seems to be every evidence that the Turkish government has for a long

time been preparing for just such an issue. By the Sultan's orders the Circassians in Armenia were armed two or three years ago, and the Armenian peasants were left helpless and with no protection.

A pretext was all that was needed to

mass the troops in one place, and having attained that the rest was an easy task. There seems to be every evidence that such atrocities will recur until the Armenian population throughout Asia Minor is exterminated, according to the desires of the

terminated, according to the desires of the authorities at Constantinople.

The eyes of the Armenians are just now turned toward Nicholas II. Just what step the young Czar will take is a matter of conjecture among them. If his policy be to redeem Armenia then the suffering peasantry of Asia Minor may look for a bright

future, but if the present condition of affairs

continues in the East the outlook is dark in the extreme.
