## SHOT AN ARMENIAN DEAD.

"Big Jim" Taylor Defends Hi House Against Five Murderous Invaders.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Sept. 14. - 'Big Jim" Taylor, proprietor of the Ironsides, a road house in Burrillville, shot and killed an Armenian named Sumpal Hinttian last midnight. Four countrymen of the victim were put to flight after a bloody fight. They had attacked the road house with the intention of killing the proprietor's wife and an inmate named Maggie McNulty.

The McNulty girl belonged in Attleboro, She had formerly lived with Paul Mass. Thompson, an Armenian, who keeps a roadhouse in North Main street. Leaving him after a quarrel she returned to find that he had

transieried his affections to another woman.

To day Maggie McNulty and Mrs. Taylor went to Thompson's house for liquid re reshments. Miss McNuity proposed to remain in the house and take her old position, but her successor objected and became so belligerent that the two visitors retreated. Five Armenians in the house, aroused by the affront to their comrade's friend, determined to follow Miss

McNulty and kill her, and also Mrs. Taylor.

The five went to Taylor's house, and, after being served with drinks, drew revolvers and knives and demanded that Taylor produce the two women. Taylor defied them, and a rough and tumble fight followed, the entire Taylor household joining in.

boremost in the ranks of the defenders was Maggie McNulty, with a big armchair, show-ering blows on the heads of the men who had come twenty miles to slay her, and the four Armenians were soon in retreat.
