

SIR ELLIS AS A BOUNCER.

Ashmead-Bartlett Ejects Disturb- ers of a Mahometan Meeting.

LONDON, May 15.—A very animated though thinly attended meeting of the Central Association of Mahometans of London was held to-night to protest against the agitation over the Armenian atrocities. Sir Ellis Ashmead-Bartlett, M. P., was on the platform. His sympathy with the Turk was made known in an open letter to Mr. Gladstone.

Mr. Gladstone and the Duke of Argyle were bitterly attacked, which caused a disturbance. Sir Ellis called for order repeatedly, then descended into the hall and personally ejected the disturbers.

Sir Ellis is American born, Brooklyn having been his birthplace.
