

CHAIRMAN M. B. SERON SPOKE.

Largely Attended Meeting of the Huntchagist Party.

Worcester's branch of the Armenian Huntchagist revolutionary party held a largely attended meeting in Grange hall, last night. The new chairman, M. B. Seron, presided, and was the principal speaker. The party, he said, is strong and as full of activity as ever. On the other hand, its enemies are disarmed, and all their efforts fall to harm in any way the interests of Huntchaghians. He next spoke about the importance of self-confidence as the key to activity and said that the condition of the nation is such that all must act with great care in their intercourse with each other. "Each individual," said the speaker, "should guard his every movement as though it was of the greatest importance to the nation's welfare. All who have consecrated themselves to the cause of freedom and who say they love the nation, have a good chance here in America to learn the alphabet of self-sacrifice and love. They cannot, however, consider themselves patriots, nor can they expect to do anything in America toward freeing their oppressed brethren if they do not love their countrymen here in this country, and show their sympathy, even at the expense of personal and material sacrifices.

"These are the first steps in the advance to this greater love of patriotism. Have confidence in yourselves, be faithful in these little things, that you may be prepared for the greater sacrifice to come. Our cause is holy and every one who works for it should be holy. Such men are what our mother Armenia now most needs."
