

ARMENIANS HAVE A PARADE.

The New-York branch of the Armenian Huntchakist party, whose headquarters are in Athens, Greece, had a torchlight parade and meeting last night. The demonstration was in commemoration of the fourth anniversary of the riot in Constantinople July 28, 1890, in which several Armenians were killed. The Armenian Huntchakist party demand that the Sultan of Turkey give Armenia self-government.

The parade started from Koster & Bial's hall, West Twenty-third-st., and proceeded to Union Square and thence by Fourteenth-st. to Eighth-ave. When Eighth-ave was reached a carriage happened along, and one of the paraders named Melkon Birefijk seized the horses by the head to make way for the procession. The driver, who was not well up in Armenian politics, plied his whip on the Armenian, and considerable excitement followed. Melkon Birefijk was arrested and taken to the West Twentieth-st police station. He was subsequently bailed in \$500. The parade then returned to Koster & Bial's hall, where speeches in favor of Armenian autonomy were made by the Rev. George H. Fillan, the Rev. K. Chitjian and others.
