

THE OUTRAGES IN ARMENIA

A Meeting To Be Held in London to Protest Against Them—The Story Told by Refugees in Athens.

LONDON, Dec. 4, 1894.—The Armenian Society of London has sent circulars to clergymen of all sects asking them to attend the meeting called for December 17 to protest against the atrocities in Armenia and calling upon the government to force Turkey to institute reforms.

A despatch from Athens says that the twenty Armenian refugees who have arrived there in a destitute condition are being lodged at the expense of local Armenians, who are themselves very poor. The refugees suffered greatly during their long wanderings.

They embarked at Trebizond in a Greek coaster, which had to call at Constantinople and Smyrna on the voyage. While in those ports the captain concealed the refugees in the hold and bunkers, fearing that the Turkish police would search the vessel.
