

TURKEY BEGINS TO TREMBLE.

Berlin Treaty Powers Will Have Nothing to Say to Her Until They Decide What to Do About Armenia.

VIENNA, Dec. 10.—All foreign diplomatic action at Constantinople has been suspended pending the exchange of views between the Berlin Treaty powers with a view to joint action on the Armenian question.

The Porte is very anxious over this new turn of affairs. The Turkish Ministry, together with Kiamil, Said and Chakir Pashas, sat continuously from noon Saturday for more than twenty-four hours.

BALTIMORE, Dec. 10.—A letter from Cardinal Gibbons, read at to-night's Armenian indignation meeting, contains these sentences:

The Christians of Armenia have been conspicuous among their Oriental coreligionists for their enlightened and progressive spirit. It is earnestly to be hoped that these alleged deeds of lawless violence will be thoroughly investigated in a calm and dispassionate spirit, so that the whole truth may be brought to light and that outraged law may be vindicated. The recital of these inhuman cruelties is calculated to fill every generous heart with righteous indignation.
