

THE ARMENIAN MASSACRE.

Orders for Consul Jewitt to Investigate It Recalled on Turkey's Protest.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—The Turkish Government has protested against the assignment of Consul Jewitt to accompany the Commission to investigate the recent massacre in Armenia, and requested that the State Department recall his orders. Mr. Gresham, therefore, to-day cabled Minister Terrell directing Jewitt to remain at Silvas. It is understood that no further action will be taken by the State Department on the Armenian question. Great Britain, it is now believed, will practically outline and carry on the investigation under the terms of her treaty with Turkey. The Porte, in objecting to Consul Jewitt's detail, is said to have been influenced by the fear that his report might bring to light the true state of affairs in Armenia, and substantiate the charges of inexcusable atrocities.
