

Turks Taught Not to Touch Britons.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 24.—Savfet Bey and two accomplices, charged with attacking a British cadet recently, have been sentenced each to eight years' imprisonment at hard labor.

LONDON, Feb. 25—4 A. M.—A despatch from Constantinople says Alexander Karatheodory Pasha will replace Rustem Pasha as Turkish Ambassador to Great Britain. The latter will be retired on a pension.

ARMENIAN MASSACRES THE THEME.

The Government to Be Asked to Intercede for the Downtrodden People.

A meeting to condemn the action of the Turkish Government in having condoned the recent Armenian massacres was held last night in the Church of the Holy Apostles, Twenty-eighth street and Ninth avenue. About two hundred and fifty Armenians occupied seats in the centre aisle.

Rev. Dr. B. E. Backus, the rector of the church, announced the objects of the meeting, and introduced Col. Alexander S. Bacon. The speaker, who has made a recent journey in Armenia, dwelt on the atrocities which have shocked the civilized world. Dr. Gabriel, a naturalized Armenian of this city, read reports of the slaughter in Armenia which had been sent to him by missionaries.
