

Nothing of any immediate consequence has taken place during the week with respect to the Armenian troubles. Mr. Gladstone has spoken in no uncertain tones, and public sentiment in England continues to grow in one direction. In opposition to all this Edward Dicey, C. B., has telegraphed to this country a very silly statement in apparent obedience to the request of a newspaper which is booming Turkey for some inexplicable reason. According to Edward Dicey, there haven't been any troubles in Armenia. They were very serious troubles, and England can't rectify them. Mr. Dicey evidently wrote this under the influence of a special firman. On Monday the Board of Foreign Missions officially stated that the Sultan of Turkey was opening all the foreign mails and was determined that no further information of the state of affairs in Armenia should reach the outside world.
