## ARMENIA SUNDAY.

The Archbishop of Canterbury has written the following letter to the Rev. Harold Duxton, hon. secretary of the Armenian Refugees' (Lord Mayor's) Fund :—

Lambeth Palace, S.E., December 21, 1916.

Dear Sir,—In view of the appalling sufferings which the Armenian and the Assyrian Christians are still enduring in such a degree as to call for the sympathy and aid of every Christian man and woman, I desire to express my approval of the request, during the coming spring, of the effort which was made last year to raise money in our churches and elsewhere for the alleviation of that dire distress.

In many churches arrangements are already being made for collections on their behalf on Sunday, February 4, and I venture to hope on that or one of the succeeding Sundays there may be a widespread effort to alleviate distresses which are literally unspeakable. The money should be sent to the secretary of the Armenian Refugees' (Lord Mayor's) Fund, 94, Victoria-street, London, S.W.
